WHAT IS SERVICE COORDINATION?

Service Coordination is a personalized service to help guide you through these otherwise confusing activities, connecting you with the providers and services tailored to your specific needs to remain healthy and live your best life.

This program is designed to provide ongoing services to stabilize the family unit. A Service Coordinator/Community Health Worker will serve as a central point of contact, to identify family needs and strengths, provide referrals to community support and reduce identified risks.

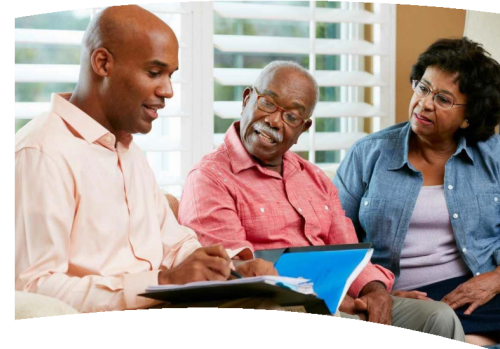
The Service Coordinator/Community Health Worker will help identify your individual needs, preferences and goals and create an individualized Care Plan to support your overall needs.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Clark County Youth, ages 0-18 years, who have needs in two or more systems, including but not limited to school, case management, Autism, developmental disabilities, and mental health.

ARE PARTICIPANTS REQUIRED TO PAY FOR SERVICES?

No. There is no fee to participate.



YOU COULD RECEIVE...

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- Supportive services to strengthen the family unit.
- A Service Coordinator/Community Health Worker acting as a central point of contact.
- An Individualized Assessment and Care Plan.
- Electronic or telephonic appointment reminders.
- Support at medical appointments.
- Explanation of covered services.
- Connections to community resources including education, substance abuse and mental health, reunification services, mentoring, child and development services and family stability solutions.
