**Early Head Start** - In partnership with Miami Valley Child Development Centers, Inc, the SCSD staff provides a weekly home-visiting program called Early Head Start using the Parents As Teachers curriculum to 77 eligible children in Clark County. Income eligible pregnant women and children 0 to 5 years of age are eligible to participate.

**Project Springboard** - A comprehensive family literacy program serving the most educationally and economically disadvantaged residents of Clark County. Adults who want to earn a high school credential who have children, ages 0 to 5 years are eligible to participate. Program operates Mon- Thursday, 9am-noon at Clark Center. Childcare and transportation support is provided.

**ASPRIRE** - to help adults increase reading, math, writing, speaking and listening skills in order to earn a high school credential, prepare for work and post-secondary education and partner in the education of their children. Daytime and evening classes are offered at the School of Innovation free of charge.

**Adult ESOL** - To provide English language instruction to adult learners as they develop their social use of the language. The course aims to prepare adult learners to use English for entering career and technical or other postsecondary education and employment. The target audience is parents of Springfield City Schools.

**McKinney Vento** - Providing support to students of SCSD who lack fixed regular and adequate nighttime residence to ensure they have equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including preschool, as other children and youth.
